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Countdown Launched for the 2020 Skills Ontario Competition

Ontario (February 21, 2020) – Canada's largest skilled trade and technology competition, the Skills Ontario Competition, is set to take place on May 4-6, 2020 at the Toronto Congress Centre.

The Skills Ontario Young Women's Conference – the largest young women's conference in Canada – and First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Student Conference, that hosts Indigenous youth from across the province, take place in conjunction with the Skills Ontario Competition. These are key events in the effort to build the momentum for a skilled, diverse, and robust workforce in Ontario.
