Ontario (March 6, 2020) – This Sunday marks International Women's Day, and Skills Ontario is proud to continue to support the movement for equality for women both inside and outside of the workplace. The Skills Ontario Young Women's Conferences are the largest young women's conferences in Canada, attracting over 2,000 young women from across Ontario to attend.

"Throughout the year, Skills Ontario shares the key message that the skilled trades and technologies are suitable for all," says Ian Howcroft, CEO of Skills Ontario. "By redefining gender roles and connecting young women to inspiring female skilled professionals, we work towards debunking misconceptions about the skilled professions being unsuitable to women. With our Young Women's Initiatives, Skills Ontario empowers young women to explore their career paths, as an inclusive workforce is a strong workforce."

In the last five years, Skills Ontario's Young Women's Initiatives have engaged over 15,600 female students, and 93% of young women surveyed have said that they are more likely to investigate a career in the skilled trades and technologies after attending a Career Exploration Event.

Skills Ontario's Young Women's Initiatives engage industry and college partners, small businesses, school boards, and students to support young women pursuing careers in the skilled trades and technologies. The Government of Ontario, Hydro One, and Magna International provide significant contributions to Skills Ontario's Young Women's Initiatives throughout the year.
