






EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATIONS

Our presentation educates students on the career opportunities available in the construction, motive power, service, industrial, and technology sectors. This presentation is updated annually and is available in both English and French, as well as in a workshop format geared toward First Nations, Métis, and Inuit audiences.


YOUNG WOMEN'S INITIATIVES

Skills Ontario's Young Women's Initiatives aim to empower young women to explore skilled careers. Alongside our Collaborating Organizations, we host Skilled Trade & Tech Days for Young Women over the school year, the International Day of The Girl activity series in October, the International Women's Day Conference in March, and the Young Women's Conference in May. The first in-person all-French conference at the 2023 Young Women's Conference. The Young Women's Conference returned to in-person at the Toronto Congress Centre this year. New this year, Skills Ontario also hosted the first in-person French Trades & Tech Day event in Ottawa and the first in-person International Day of the Girl Conference in Sudbury. FIRST NATIONS, MÉTIS, AND INUIT INITIATIVES

Skills Ontario delivers programming to Indigenous youth through its First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Initiatives. With In-School Presentations, Skilled Trades & Technology Days, Indigenous College Recruiter Information Sessions, Community Build Summer Camps, Student Challenges, and the Student Conference, these programs are for Indigenous youth to learn about the skilled trades and technologies and to hear from community members who work in these fields.

Through a continued commitment to acknowledge and respect Indigenous peoples and their history, all of Skills Ontario's events begin with a land acknowledgement and recognition of Indigenous peoples and their connection to this land. Skills Ontario also prioritizes Indigenous representation by firstly seeking staff and event speakers from Indigenous backgrounds.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION INITIATIVES

Skills Ontario is committed to creating equal opportunities for all youth by removing barriers and providing career exploration programs. Youth need to overcome critical barriers to be successful. Lack of experience, lack of relevant skills, and limited access to professional networks are just a few of the issues in Canadian communities today. To combat this, in 2021 Skills Ontario started focusing on creating programming and events for those facing barriers getting into the Skilled Trades. Events such as the Skilled Trades & Tech Inclusivity Series, the Rise Series for new Canadians, the Umoja Series for Black youth, the Urban Tech Workshop, and the Tools for Success Workshops, Skills Ontario continues to work towards building a diverse, robust workforce.

THE SKILLS ONTARIO COMPETITION


The largest skilled trades competition in Canada, the Skills Ontario Competition annually welcomes thousands of visitors, exhibitors, and competitors each May. From animation to horticulture, welding to baking, this is the ultimate display of the future of skilled trades and technologies! The Skills Ontario Competition offers an experiential opportunity for competitors to demonstrate their skills, wowing educators, family, friends, and prospective employers. It's also a great way for spectators to learn more about these in demand careers opportunities and to explore at their own pace!

The two-day competition offers over 70 skilled trades and technology-based contests, an interactive Career Exploration Showcase, live demonstrations, hands on Elementary Workshops, plus a number of conferences including both English and French Young Women's Conferences, a First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Student Conference and professional development conference for guidance counsellors and teaching professionals.

Closing Ceremony takes place on the third day, where competitors, educators, stakeholders, partners and more come together in an exciting presentation of awards and prizes. Many of those who win gold gain the opportunity to represent our province at the Skills Canada National Competition as a part of Team Ontario! Every other year, competitors at the National Competition in select contests have the chance to qualifying as part of Team Canada to compete at WorldSkills.










JUNK DRAWER RACES

In fall 2021, Skills Ontario launched the Junk Drawer Races, a new competition program where students from grades 2 to 12 can compete in curriculum-based, skill-developing contests.

With a Gravity Powered Robot Walker Race (for grades 2-3), a Cardboard Car Race (for grades 4-5), a Paper Glider Competition (for grades 6-7), a Hydraulic Crane Challenge (for grade 8), and an Air Pressure Rocket Challenge (for grades 9-12), youth are given the opportunity to try a hands-on approach in their exploration of skilled trades and technologies.

With emphasis on topics tied to curriculum such as flight technology, design, systems in action, and more, youth can participate in teams to build and race their structure in an attempt to advance from the regional level to the province-wide championship level. THE SKILLED TRADES CONFERENCE FOR GUIDANCE EDUCATORS

In 2023, Skills Ontario hosted the Skilled Trades Conference for Guidance Educators. This new, one-day event aims to help guidance counselors, tech teachers, and curriculum leaders understand the different pathways to a career in the skilled trades and resources available for students to achieve these careers.

During the conference, participants heard from three different panels of speakers, one of which included a WorldSkills Bronze Winner. The conference featured TV's Kayleen McCabe as Keynote speaker to speak about the skilled trades and apprenticeships. Held at the 2023 Skills Ontario Competition, participants were provided networking opportunities and visited sponsor booths, and checked out the Skilled Trades & Tech Truck.

In July 2023, Skills Ontario received an investment of \$5.4 million from the Ontario Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development to expand the Trades & Tech Truck program to include three additional learning mobile units which will travel across the province. 




PODCAST & APP



LEARNING TOOLS & RESOURCES


