**ADVANCEMENT FROM QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS TO SKILLS ONTARIO COMPETITION**Competitors at the Qualifying Competitions **must achieve a <u>final score of at least 60%</u>** to receive any ribbon and be considered for advancement.

The following numbers of competitors from the Central Area Qualifying Competition are eligible to advance to the 2020 Skills Ontario Competition, taking place May 4-6, 2020 in Toronto:

- Carpentry Individual 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- Culinary Arts 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>
- T.V. Video Production (Team of 2) 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- Welding 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>

#### **Advancement Policy**

The competitors/teams with the three highest scores in each contest will advance to the Skills Ontario Competition, regardless of their school board representation, ie. if the top two scores are from the same school board, both will receive ribbons and advance. Each school board may request up to **TWO** (2) spaces per contest and both will be eligible to advance.






