

## Tips for Groups Visiting Skills Canada – Ontario's Ontario Technological Skills Competition

Each year over 20,000 students, teachers, parents and members of the general public come to RIM Park to observe the Ontario Technological Skills Competition. With such a crowd converging on one venue over a short two-day period, it is helpful to plan your trip with this mass of people in mind. We hope the tips listed below assist you in planning a fun and valuable class trip for your students, while keeping everyone safe and happy.

- All bus drop-off and pick-up will happen on University Avenue East coming up to RIM Park.
- Make a brightly coloured sign clearly identifying your group to put in the bus window this will make it easier for you and your students to pick your bus out of the line of identical school buses.
- Exchange cell phone numbers with your bus driver this may help you connect when it's time to board the bus.
- Arrange a meeting place and time with your students prior to arriving at RIM Park, ie. at the Home and Team Building Tent. Please note: there is no PA system that can be used to page students.
  - The designated "lost and found" persons area is the space located between the 4 Ice Pads, inside the main door (near the elevator). Our staff will direct any lost people or people looking for lost people to this area.
- Instruct your students to use the buddy-system. When exploring the event, no student should be left to tour alone.
- Review the floor plan, ahead of time, with your students. They will benefit from being familiar with the layout of the venue.
  - Print copies of the floor plan for your students, with your meeting place (and perhaps your cell phone number) clearly marked on them.
  - First Aid Stations are marked on the floor plan point this out to your students, in case of an emergency.
  - Designate a location that you will stop at throughout the day, where your students can find you if they
    need to make this location clear to your students, ie. the seating area in Ice Pad #1 (behind the
    Baking and Culinary Arts contest areas).
- Instruct your students to dress for the weather, as some contests take place outside.
- Pack a lunch or a lot of patience the concession lines can be very long, especially at peak lunch hour times.
- Plan an activity for your students to complete throughout the day. There is a Scavenger Hunt Activity posted on our website that you are welcome to use.
