Please go over our **Camper Code of Conduct** with your child to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone.

- Campers are expected to show a general respect towards nature, fellow campers, and staff members and in return will be guaranteed the same respect from others.
- Skills Canada – Ontario has a **zero tolerance** policy on violence. Our staff is trained and willing to deal with behavioural issues; however, if any camper poses a threat, or carries out an act of violence on another person, parents will be contacted to pick up their child immediately. Further return to camp may be negotiated.
- If a camper is purposely causing harm to themselves or others, by damaging property or engaging in unsafe behaviour they may be asked not to participate in the workshop or activity. If they continue to act in an unsafe manner, parents will be contacted.
- Skills Canada – Ontario does not tolerate foul language or improper comments towards other participants or staff. Our campers are to demonstrate a positive attitude towards campers of different race, religion, background, and ability.
- Camp staff reserves the right to deal with inappropriate clothing at their discretion. We ask that campers refrain from wearing clothing with unacceptable phrases or pictures such as offensive language or improper advertisements.
- Campers are asked to leave ALL toys, **including ALL electronic devices**, water guns, cards and hand-held video games at home.
- Occasionally, camp workshops will involve the use of computers with internet connection. As with other tools, campers are expected to use this technology only as instructed by camp leaders and as required for the workshop and to avoid/report inappropriate or unsafe use of technology.
