CHALLENGE

Women Pioneers in Industrial: Meet Sarah A. Erwin

During the Second World War, hundreds of thousands of women answered the call and took over essential jobs in Canadian and US industries to produce desperately needed war material. Prior to "Rosie the Riveter" era of WWII, there was Sarah A. Erwin. She applied for a job at the Hog Island shipyard, where she was placed in the electrical welding department. She did such an amazing job that 30 more women were hired on to work in the same department.



What is Metal Fabrication?

Metal fabrication is creating structures by the joining, shaping and assembling of metal together. When doing metal fabrication, the most common way of joining is by welding. Welding is the most economical and efficient way to join metals permanently: it is the only way of joining two or more pieces of metal to make them act as a single piece.

Your challenge is to design and construct (or fabricate) a cardboard tube structure using toilet paper (or paper towel rolls). You are to glue (or weld) your pieces onto the back of a 12 inch by 12 inch piece of cardboard creating a unique and creative design.

CHALLENGE MATERIALS

- Toilet paper /paper towel rolls (alternative option: thinly cut strips of cardstock)
- Scissors
- Hot glue gun (have a parent/guardian assist you) or white glue
- Cardboard backing (12in x 12in)
- Paint or spray paint



RULES

- **1.** You must create your design on paper first. The more detailed the plan, the better.
- **2.** The main structure must be composed only of either toilet paper / paper towel rolls or an alternative could be used (see note above).
- **3.** Glue your pieces onto a cardboard backing that measures 12 inches by 12 inches.
- **4.** Paint and decorate your sculpture to make it look like it is metal.
- 5. You will need to highlight what empowers you or how you empower others. See full submission details below.
