SUDBURY | OTTAWA | BRACEBRIDGE

This year's International Day of the Girl (IDG) celebrations were bigger and better than ever! Classrooms across the province participated in a virtual Character Animation Challenge, along with new episodes of our Sit-Down Series. While we are seeing strong and growing engagement in our virtual programming, our in-person celebration events continue to be the highlight—and once again reached full capacity.

We were thrilled to return to the Canada Science and Technology Museum in Ottawa and Science North in Sudbury, and to introduce our newest celebration location at Georgian College in Bracebridge.

In both Ottawa and Sudbury, we welcomed 150 girls in Grades 7 and 8 from both French and English school boards for a full day of hands-on learning and inspiration. Students rotated through a variety of engaging workshops and "Try-A-Trade" exhibitor stations, and each event featured a bilingual formal program. In Sudbury, students heard from a panel of OYAP students, while in Ottawa they enjoyed an inspiring keynote from Captain Cathy Fraser. Captain Fraser shared insights from her 35-year—and counting—aviation career, during which she has flown a wide range of aircraft and held roles including corporate pilot, charter pilot, cargo pilot, and flight instructor.

Our first year in Bracebridge was a tremendous success. Exhibitors once again answered the call, bringing hands-on activities that kept students engaged at every table. Eighty students took part in the day's festivities. Over lunch, the formal program opened with welcoming remarks from Mayor Maloney. The program also featured an outstanding keynote from Michelle Mulder—roofer, business owner, and international athlete—who shared her journey of discovering "her spark" in the skilled trades. Her spark analogy resonated strongly with all our guests and has become a defining theme of this quarter.

Students rotated through five interactive stations, 30 minutes in each, learned about real pathways into the industry, and even got to meet junior techs currently progressing through their training.

After the prizes were claimed, students split into three groups to take part in hands-on workshops.

Rounding out the day, Skills Ontario guided students through building their very own lamps to take home—a highlight for many.
