Women Pioneers in Industrial!

During the Second World War, hundreds of thousands of women answered the call and took over essential jobs in Canadian and US industries to produce desperately needed war material. These women, who at one point accounted for over 65% of the entire US aircraft industry, were known as “Rosie the Riveter,” and became an enduring symbol of the sacrifices and contributions women made during the war.

One of the most important tasks they took on was welding, which is the joining of metals. Here’s your chance to be a “Rosie the Riveter,” and “weld” together popsicle sticks using a hot glue gun to create your favourite playground equipment! The challenge is simple: create a plan, and then put it into action by creating as many pieces of playground equipment as you like!

What is Welding?

Welding is the most economical and efficient way to join metals permanently. It is the only way of joining two or more pieces of metal to make them act as a single piece. Welding is vital to our economy as welders are employed in many industries like aerospace, auto repair, military support, construction, etc.

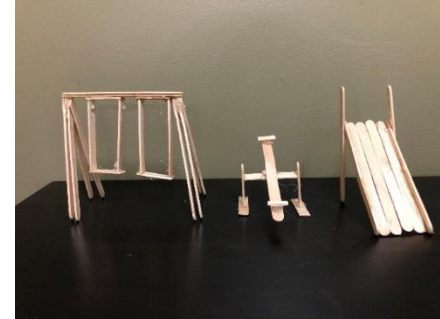


CHALLENGE MATERIALS
