ADVANCEMENT FROM QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS TO SKILLS ONTARIO COMPETITION

Competitors at the Qualifying Competitions **must achieve a final score of at least 60%** to receive any ribbon and be considered for advancement.

The following numbers of competitors from the Central Area Qualifying Competition are eligible to advance to the 2019 Skills Ontario Competition, taking place May 6-8, 2019 in Toronto:

- Carpentry – Individual – 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- Culinary Arts – 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- T.V. Video Production (Team of 2) – 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- Welding – 1st, 2nd and 3rd

NEW 2019 Advancement Policy

The competitors/teams with the three highest scores in each contest will advance to the Skills Ontario Competition, regardless of their school board representation, ie. if the top two scores are from the same school board, both will receive ribbons and advance. Each school board may request up to **TWO (2)** spaces per contest and both will be eligible to advance.

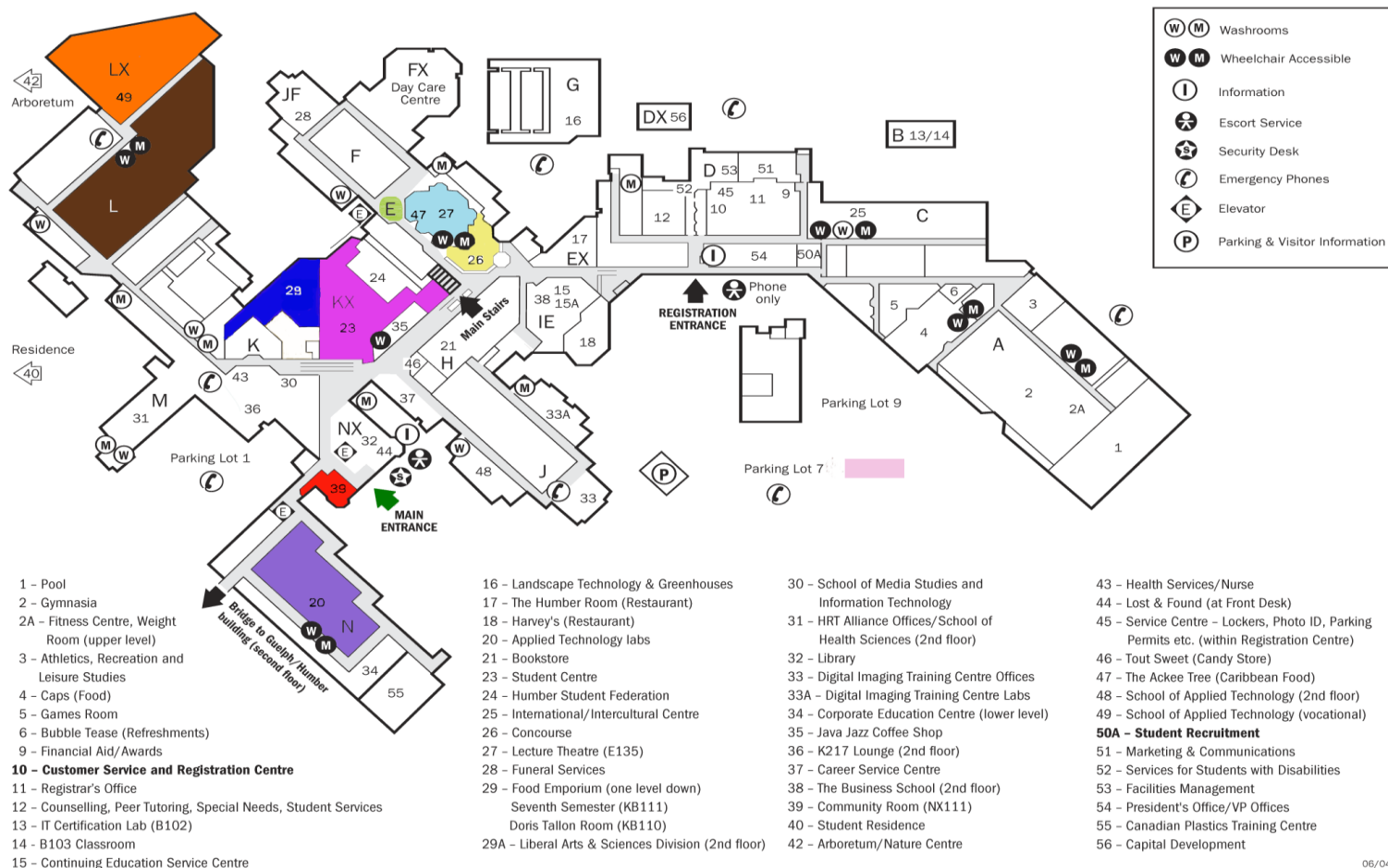
Humber College Institute of Technology North Campus is easily accessible from Highway 401, and the following map will assist participants in locating the campus:

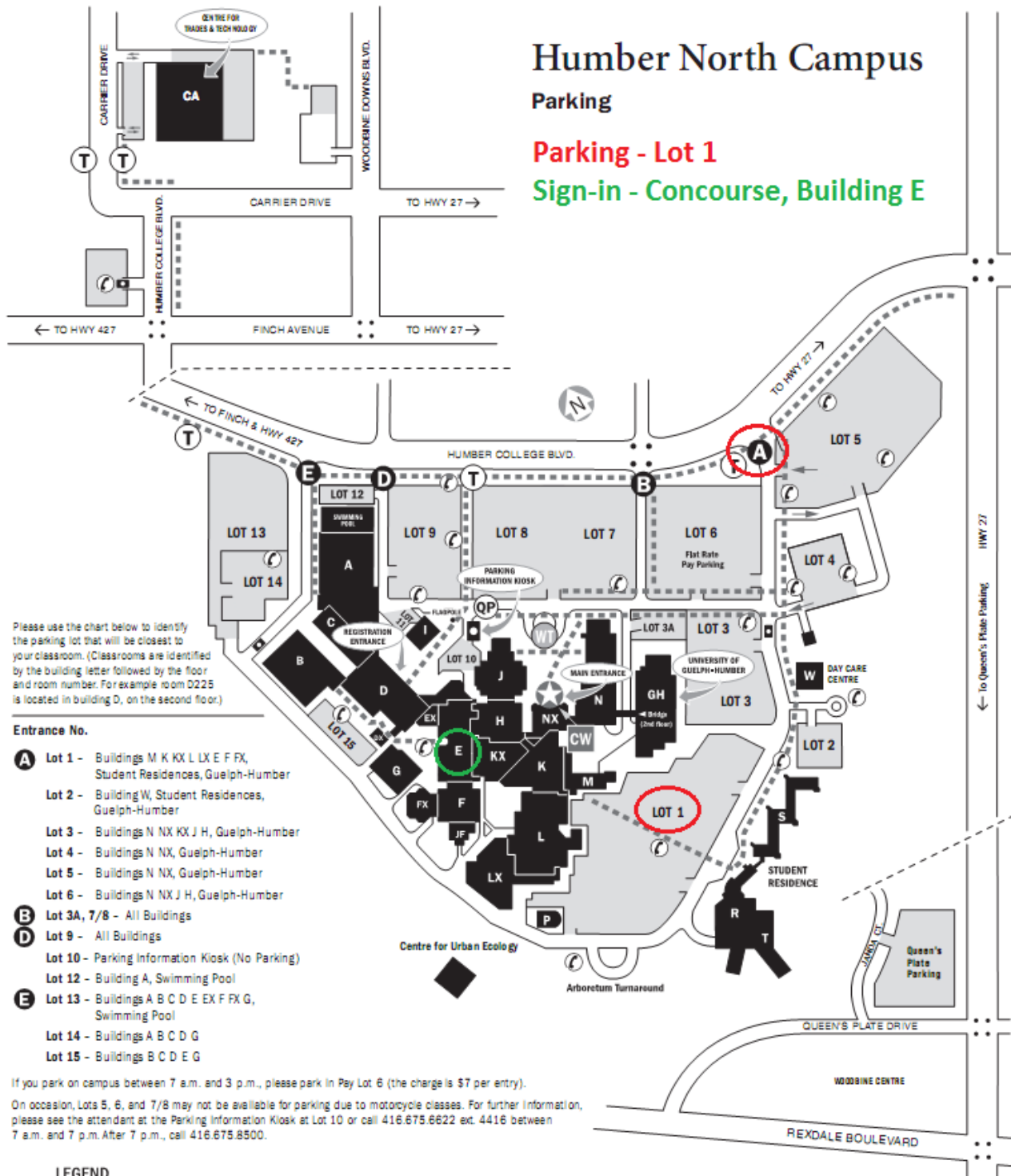

Parking: Free parking is provided at the North Campus. Please enter through Driveway A, and proceed to Lot #1

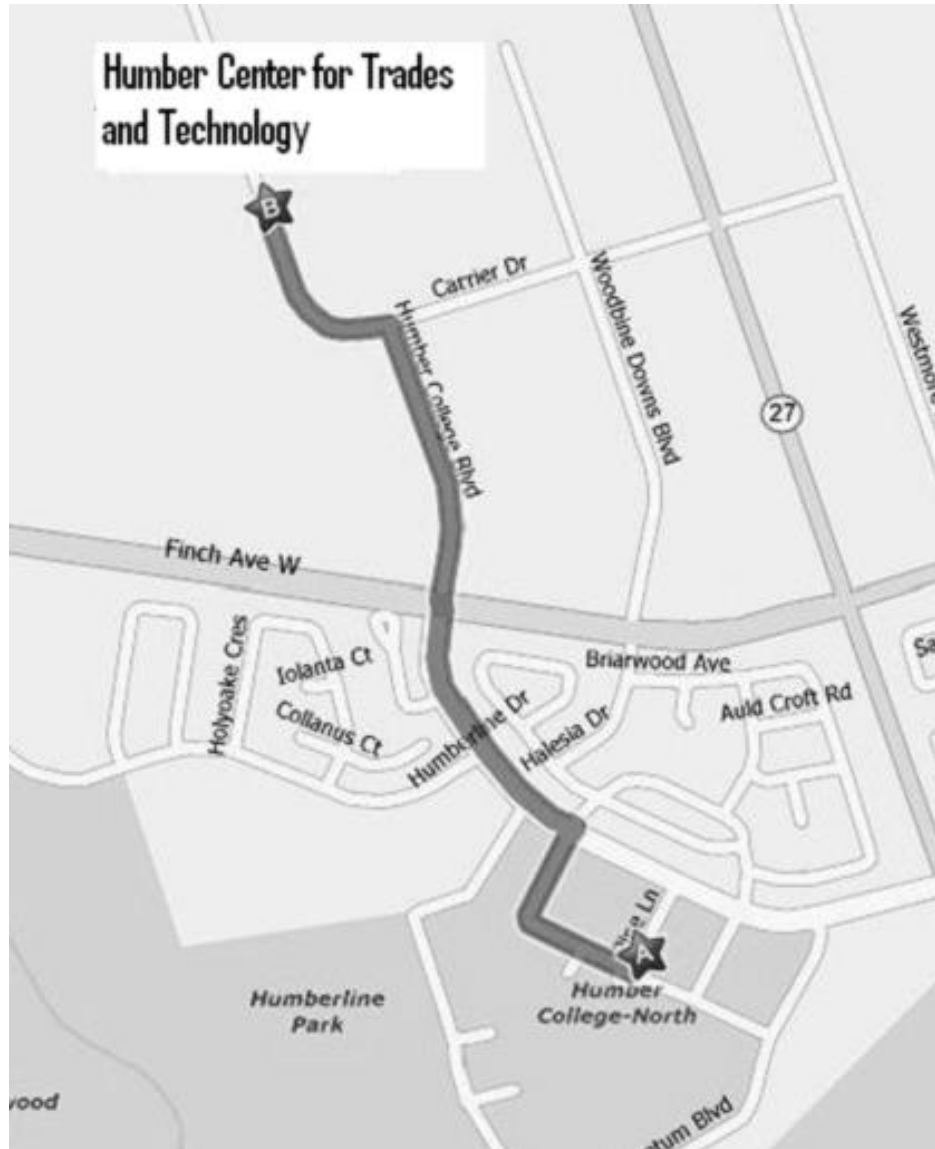
