RESEARCH GUIDELINES

Students are required to complete a research component for this challenge. Students must consider researching the following:

- Job description
- Education & Training
- Educational Institutions that offer a program connected to this occupation
- Salary
- Job Market
- Locations in Ontario where you can find this occupation
- Characteristics of individuals in this occupation

SCORING/JUDGING
